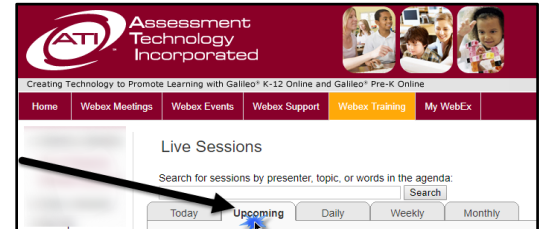

Using the Galileo G3 Assessment Scales

Thursday, **October 4th**

Time: 5:00-6:00 pm EDT / 2:00-3:00 pm MST

Audience: All Galileo Users

Description: This session provides participants with an overview of the Galileo G3 assessment scales. Participants will learn about the age-ranged scales, the domains covered, and how scales are structured and sequenced. Participants will also learn how to familiarize themselves with the scales before recording observations.

Anecdotal Notes

Friday, **October 19th**

Time: 5:00-5:30 pm EDT / 2:00-2:30 pm MST

Audience: Teachers, teacher aides, disability specialists, and administrators responsible for documenting or overseeing the documenting of child observations.

Description: This session walks participants through the process of writing anecdotal notes using the Galileo System. Special emphasis is placed on strategies for being accurate and objective when using Galileo to record notes.

Getting Ready for Parent-Teacher Conferences

Monday, **November 5th**

Time: 4:00-4:45 pm EST / 2:00-2:45 pm MST

Audience: Teachers, teacher aides, and other educators responsible for communicating with parents.

Description: This session walks participants through generating and interpreting the *Individual Development Profile*, *Individual Observation Record*, and the *Parent Activity* reports. Participants will also learn how parents access and navigate the *Pre-K Parent Center* and access the class notes, child notes, published activities and lesson plans.

Initial Observations for the New Program Year

Audience: Teachers, teacher aides, and administrators responsible for documenting or overseeing the documenting of child observations

Description: This session walks participants through the process of establishing a baseline assessment for new children at the beginning of the year and saving initial observations for a returning child using the *Observations by Child* page.

Entering Ongoing Observations

Audience: Teachers, teacher aides, and administrators responsible for documenting or overseeing the documenting of child observations

Description: This session walks participants through the process of entering ongoing observations using the *Observations by Child, Class, and Goal* pages.

Linking Assessment to Lesson Planning

Audience: Teachers, Teacher Aides, and administrators responsible for documenting or overseeing the documenting of child observations.

Description: This session introduces participants to the early intervention cycle of goal setting, assessing, planning for and evaluating children's learning. Participants learn the ways in which assessment data may be used to inform and support the provision of learning opportunities and planning for children.

Using Galileo's Model Curriculum

Audience: Teachers, Teacher Aides, and administrators responsible for creating and overseeing the creation of weekly lesson plans.

Description: This session walks participants through accessing and incorporating the Galileo Pre-K Online Curriculum into weekly planning. Participants will explore ATI's resource materials, model lesson plans, and activities.

Galileo Parental Toolkit for Spanish-Speaking Parents

Audience: Teachers, Teacher Aides, and other educators responsible for communicating with Spanish-speaking parents.

Description: This session walks participants through how parents access and navigate the *Pre-K Parent Center*, generate the *Individual Development Profile and Observation Record* reports, and access the Spanish-version of activities. Participants will also learn how to copy an assessment onto a Spanish version of a scale.
